Dear friends,

Let me begin, by once again thanking you for your support of Hacienda Children's Hospital. We are grateful and humbled to be one of the charities that you have selected to support since the hospital opened in 2015. Your giving of time, in-kind gifts, and donations has made a difference in the lives of medically fragile and chronically ill infants, children, teens, and their families.

Since our opening more than 90% of the families we served came from extremely low-income households (0-30% AMI – Area Medium Income). Besides training the families on caring for their children, we have at times provided rent money, paid utilities, donated baby furnishings, car seats, and holiday gifts, because of your generosity. For example, we partnered with Mesa and Tempe fire fighters to provide a home with household furnishings, clothing, and food for a single grandmother who was taking care of several of her grandchildren because their parents were unable. We made sure that each child discharged from Hacienda Children's Hospital was discharged to a safe environment and you helped us do this.

It is with my deepest regret to inform you that our beloved Hacienda Children's Hospital will no longer serve medically fragile children who need our specialized care. We have been serving this population of children since 1994 when we opened our first hospital called Los Niños Hospital in Phoenix. To serve the east valley and provide state of the art facilities and a family friendly hospital, we opened Hacienda Children's in 2015. We consolidated the two hospitals under Hacienda Children's in 2017.

Our hospital has always been a separate nonprofit entity with its own 501 C 3 designation since 2015. All of our Form 990 tax returns are audited by Henry & Horne, LLP and are available for view on www.Guidestar.org under Hacienda Children's Hospital.

Due to changes in insurance reimbursements and the highly publicized "Hacienda HealthCare" news of sexual assault resulting in the birth of a healthy baby boy at the south Phoenix location, our hospital has been negatively impacted both with the name "Hacienda" and financially. Although the hospital is a separate entity, it had been receiving financial support from Hacienda HealthCare since it was built. With the heavy expenses coupled with the State's moratorium preventing Hacienda from receiving new clients, the Board of Directors had to make some very difficult decisions. One was to

close Hacienda Children's Hospital in Mesa and the other to close our 19-year-old pediatric/young adult Skilled Nursing Facility in south Phoenix.

There is not much more I can say, except that unfortunate events happened so quickly, and the media frenzy that demonized the Hacienda name, caused irreparable harm. The type of service that our specialized children's hospital provided is greatly needed in our community as the number of medically complex children continues to grow with advances in medicine and technology. For families that have the means, they can find help. For those on the lower end of the income spectrum it will mean more visits to the emergency room and inequitable access to care. As one of a handful of hospitals throughout the country that has provided this level of care, I am hopeful that another will arise.

You made a difference in the lives of these children and their families. Thank you so much for your support, caring and understanding. I am available to answer any questions and I am happy to meet with you face to face either individually or in a group setting.

Our hospital will officially close September 30, 2019.
