Post 39 Service Officer Nov 2016 Summary

Military Retirement Divorce -

A service member's military retired pay can be a valuable asset in a divorce, legal separation or dissolution of marriage. In 1982 Congress passed the Uniformed Services Former Spouse Protection Act, which allows state courts to treat disposable retired pay either as property solely of the member, or as property of the member and his spouse in accordance with the laws of the state court. Contrary to popular belief, there is no "magic formula" contained in the act to determine the appropriate division of retired pay. A state court can divide retired pay in any way it chooses (subject to the laws of that state). All 50 states treat military pension as marital or community property.



The Veterans Health Administration is America's largest integrated health care system with over 1,700 sites of care, serving 8.76 million Veterans each year. If you enrolled in VA health care, you do not need to take additional steps to meet the

Affordable Care coverage standards. In addition, enrollment in VA means you can enjoy:

- Medical care rated among the best in the U.S.
- Immediate benefits of health care coverage. Veterans may apply for VA health care enrollment at any time.
- No enrollment fee, monthly premiums, or deductibles. Most Veterans have no out-of-pocket costs. Some Veterans may have to pay small copayments for health care or prescription drugs.
- More than 1,500 places available to get your care. This means your coverage can go with you if you travel or move.
- Health care coverage that meets the minimum essential coverage standard

If you have other forms of health care coverage, such as a private insurance plan, Medicare, Medicaid or TRICARE, you can continue to use your VA health care benefits along with these plans. See VA Eligibility Counselor for details

Automobile and Special Adaptive Equipment Grants

Effective January 13, 2016 all veterans with service connected ALS or Lou Gehrig's Disease can now receive a cash grant to purchase a vehicle

Eligibility Requirements for the VA Automobile Grant:

Military members and veterans with service-connected:

- Loss, or permanent loss of use, of one or both feet, OR
- Loss, or permanent loss of use, of one or both hands, OR
- Permanent impairment of vision in both eyes to a certain degree, OR
- Severe burn injury, OR
- Amyotrophic Lateral Sclerosis (ALS).

The grant is paid directly to the seller of the automobile for the total price (up to \$20,235.20) of the automobile. The veteran or service member may only receive the automobile grant *once* in his/her lifetime.

Eligibility Requirements for the VA Automobile Special Adaptive Equipment Grant

Those qualified for the automobile grant, and veterans or service members with immobility of the joint (ankylosis) of one or both knees or hips resulting from an injury or disease incurred or aggravated by active military service may also qualify for the adaptive equipment grant. Adaptive equipment includes, but is not limited to, power steering, power brakes, power windows, power seats, and special equipment necessary to assist the eligible person into and out of the vehicle. Contact should be made with your local VA medical center's Prosthetic Department prior to purchasing any equipment. Veterans and service members can apply for the automobile and/or the special adaptive equipment grant by completing VA Form 21-4502

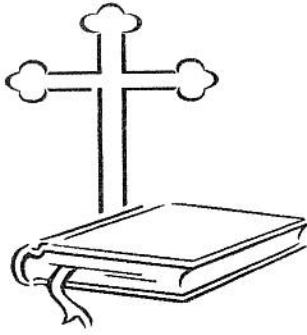
